NOTE from the ECCLESIASTICAL ADVISOR

It gives me an immense joy to send this Message to the forthcoming Annual General Body Meeting of our Catholic Club scheduled for 26th June, 2022.

The situation around us is almost getting back to normal. However, there is a tinge of fear still in us whether the Covid pandemic would appear in any other variant-names. The physical distancing measures necessitated by the COVID-19 pandemic have resulted in a massive withdrawal from the habitual patterns of daily life and in significantly less contact with other people. To many, such withdrawal has led to disconnection and loneliness, a major cause of stress, anxiety, depressive symptoms, self-harm, and suicidal ideation. Thank God, most have us have been protected and safeguarded from this Covid pandemic, except a few who had succumbed to it or experienced setbacks in their health conditions. Let's hope that such situation won't come again! Yes, the AGM is indeed a great occasion for us to meet with one another and exchange our greetings and share our joys and sorrows, and thus promote our fellowship. I am also happy to share this short story on the Butterfly and the lesson that it communicates to all of us!

One day a small gap appeared in the cocoon, through which the butterfly had to appear. A boy, who accidentally passed by, stopped and watched how the butterfly was trying to get out of the cocoon! It took a lot of time, the butterfly was trying very hard, and the gap was as little as before. It seemed that the power would leave the butterfly soon.

The boy decided to help the butterfly. He took a penknife and cut the cocoon. The butterfly immediately got out, but its body was weak and feeble, and the wings were barely moving. The boy continued to watch the butterfly, thinking that now its wings would spread and it would fly. However, that did not happen.

The rest of its life the butterfly had to drag its weak body and wings that weren't spread. It was unable to fly, because the boy did not realize that an effort to enter through the narrow gap of the cocoon was necessary for the butterfly, so that the life-giving fluid would move from the body to the butterfly's wings and that the butterfly could fly. Life forced the butterfly to leave its shell hardly, so that it would become stronger and would be able to grow and develop.



This episode has a lesson for us. There are times when things go wrong in life. Most of us try to escape it, denying the truth life presents to us. When a problem occurs, most of the time it occurs because something is not right -- we got sick because we haven't been eating right; we are in hefty debt because we didn't live within our means; we got backstabbed because we're too trusting; many relationships are breaking up because we're too controlling -- the list goes on and on.

Instead of looking at external circumstances and blaming them for unfortunate life events, let's look at ourselves first and see if there's anything we can improve. Failing to accept the truth life presents to us, we will forever fall into the traps we can never seem to escape.

If we were allowed to live without meeting difficulties, we would not be viable. Life gives us challenges to make us stronger!

Major Arya, Additional Commissioner of Income Tax, Bangalore, belongs to the 2004 batch of the Indian Revenue Service. He worked in various capacities and was responsible for carrying out Enforcement actions against tax evasion. As part of the Indian Army, PARA (TA), he has worked extensively with the Elite Para Regiment (Special Forces), in Counter Insurgency & Counter Terrorism (CICT) Operations in the hostile environment of Jammu & Kashmir and the North Fastern states.

He has the distinct honour of serving both in the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Defence simultaneously. A few of his achievements are listed below:

- a. During his post commission training at Indian Military Academy Dehra Dun, 2013, he was adjudged the Best Officer Trainee in overall order of merit and was recipient of:
 - Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Gold Medal
 - Brigadier KP Singh Deo Medal for Best in Physical Training ii.
 - Gold Medal for Best in Camps, Outdoor Exercises and Activities
- b. Awarded the Additional Director General, Territorial Army Citation, 2014, for his distinguished services and being a role model to other officers and men in the Territorial Army.
- c. He was conferred the Chief of Army Staff (COAS) Commendation, 2017, for contribution in investigation and tracking Money Laundering and flow of funds, for terrorism and anti-national activities.
- Shaurya Chakra, during Republic Day 2018, for valour and gallant action by the Honourable President of India. Shri Ram Nath Kovind.
- He is the first civil servant in the history of Independent India to receive the Gallantry Award for Valour in Action/Neutralizing Terrorists.
- Received the National Award, 2013, by the Honourable Ex-President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee for Best Electoral Practices – instituted by the Election Commission of India in effectively controlling large quantity of cash during elections in Karnataka and North East state of Nagaland.
- Conferred the Karnataka Rajyotsava Award 2018, by the State Government of Karnataka in recognition of his distinguished service and contribution in various fields including defence.

Alumnus of Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) New Delhi, National Law School Hyderabad, Indian School of Business, Hyderabad, Sanford School of Public Policy, Duke University, USA.

A commercial pilot by profession, he holds a Masters each in Sociology, Business Administration, Law, Taxation and PhD in Psephology (Voting behaviour).

The Government of Karnataka nominated him as the Chief Co-ordinator for Covid-19 pandemic relief. He displayed exemplary leadership with meticulous planning, addressed several issues of labourers, pan-African and North-East population and other marginalized sections of society.

On National Civil Service Day 2020, Major Arya was acknowledged as "Steel frame of India" and honoured as one among the major civil servants from across the nation for his relentless services, staunch commitment and work towards the cause of the citizens. - 8. Matters arising out of the Minutes of the 68th Annual General Body Meeting held on 16th June 2019. The President said that there was a concern about the bulk SMSs that had been sent out to groups of Members for preferred Managing Committee candidates prior to the 68th AGM. He said the matter has been addressed. The PIT Committee had investigated and presented their findings. See below:
 - 1. Proof of exported data of all phone numbers was there on the administration computer which was easily accessible to anybody. There was an email (believed to be 9th June 2019) sent from that machine to the President's email address.
 - 2. The PIT's inference was that as the file is on the machine and was also sent to people on email, this list can easily be used for all kinds of nefarious purposes.
 - 3. Another thought process could be that this was cloud-sourced data where people can share numbers of people and friends and then someone sends a SMS from a bulk SMS service provider to the numbers that have been collected. This is possible, as we do not know if all Club Members got this SMS, or it was a set of people who got it.
 - 4. We traced the SMS service provider to be someone from Haryana
 - 5. Lastly, we also investigated with the background ERP software vendor, Clubman, who has the source of truth in the database. Mr Sandeep, CEO, confirmed that he did not share the Members list with anyone. Data privacy being fundamental to how Clubman conducts their business from a compliance perspective.

Sydney D'Sa (Membership #1798) – suggested that a CCTV be installed in the room so that people who use the computer could be tracked. The President said the matter has been resolved but they would look at ways to ensure this does not happen again.

Due to the pandemic, the Club had to take some harsh measures such as salary cuts, lay-offs and other measures to reduce and control the deficit. The investment of the Club has reduced by 2%. This year the depreciation amount has decreased by 1%.

The President announced that the Managing Committee has made provisions to make the long overdue payment of Rs. 18.46 lakhs to the Archdiocese of Bangalore for the capital expenditure incurred for the St Thomas Deck and Sportico buildings. As part of the Bangalore Safe City Project, the Club has incurred an expenditure of Rs. 5.3 lakhs (CCTV cameras and other associated aggregates installed by the Jurisdictional Police). These cameras do not record the movements inside the Club. The Club has its own CCTV equipment to record activities in the Club premises.

He thanked the Club Staff and Accounts team who had been co-operative in implementing changed protocols in the functioning of the departments. He thanked all Members of the Managing Committee who adopted all his protocols.

Proposed: It shall be the responsibility of the Club to inform the Senior Citizen, Privileged Senior Citizen and Senior Dependent Members in writing regarding their rights and privileges and the date on which it takes effect.

Reason: Member centric approach

- the Management and the Office are for the Members and not vice-versa.

9.1 Contd.

Existing: If an applicant proposed for Membership fails to attend three interviews or one year, whichever is more, such application shall automatically be rejected, and entrance fee paid by the applicant shall be refunded without any interest. However, the applicant shall be eligible to reapply for the Membership after a period of one year from the date of rejection.

Proposed: An applicant proposed for Membership will be officially informed by the Secretary to attend the Membership Interview on a designated date and time If the applicant does not present himself/herself on the 1^{st} interview date, he/she will be officially informed by the Secretary to attend the membership interview on the next designated date and time. If the applicant does not present himself/herself on the 2^{nd} interview date, he/she will be officially informed by the Secretary to attend the membership interview on the next designated date and time.

If the applicant informs the Club in writing, before any of the 3 interview dates, that he/she is unable to attend the membership interview, his/her application shall not be rejected but retained in the Membership Waiting List until such time the Applicant informs in writing that he/she is able to present himself/herselfforthe next membership interview.

If the applicant does not inform in writing to the Club, before the 3^{rd} interview date, his/her inability to attend the membership interview, the application shall be automatically rejected and entrance fee paid by the applicant shall be refunded without any interest.

Reason: Applicants for membership may be out of the country for their studies which, in some cases could take up to 4 years. It may not be economically possible for the applicant to come to Bangalore only for the membership interview. Also, understand that all other Clubs have a system as proposed here for prospective members.

Greg D'Sa (Membership #234) – asked that the word 'Reject' be substituted with 'Withdraw' or some other word.

Brian D'Lima (Membership #204) – asked if there was a cap on the number of years. Is the eligibility for any period of time? The President replied in the affirmative.

Existing: Membership strength

The number of permanent members (Patron, Donor, Life and Ordinary) shall not exceed 3200 by June 2018, 3300 by June 2019 and 3400 by June 2020.

The number of Associate members (non-voting) shall not exceed 320 by June 2018, 330 by June 2019 and 340 by June 2020 (AGM 2017-18).

Proposed: Membership strength

The number of permanent members (Patron, Donor, Life and Ordinary) shall not exceed 3500 by June 2022, 3600 by June 2023 and 3700 by June 2024.

The number of Associate members (non-voting) shall not exceed 350 by June 2022, 360 by June 2023 and 370 by June 2024.

Brian D'Lima (Membership #204) – asked what the rule is for children of Members as they have to be given preference. He said that those who had applied over 8 months ago are yet to hear from the Club. They have to be admitted as Member-in-waiting.

President confirmed that they are considered as Member-in-Waiting without going through an interview. The child of a Membe always gets preference over any new applicant.

Any other business for which Notice has been given on or before 21st November 2021 19.2

The President said that an email has been received from the Archbishop's House asking for a revision in rent. The email was displayed on the screen and a few excerpts read out for the benefit of the House.

Excerpt – The Archdiocesan Estate Committee proposes a revised rent for Catholic Club based on per square foot of the leased land (43,560 sqft). You are aware of the present ground rent in Museum/Brigade Road, Bengaluru is Rs.60 and above. Sqft 43,560 x Rs.55 per sqft is proposed.

Ian Faria (Membership #357) – said that he was part of the team when permission for development was given to the Club. Rent was small and a rider that 5% needed to be paid for each building completed. Then it was raised to 7%. He urged Fr Jayanathan to convey to the Archbishop that the Club Members are also Members of the Church. The Club is not a commercial tenant. So, to charge commercial market rates was unreasonable. There is no way the Club can afford the hiked rent proposed. The Club was started as a spiritual forum for the Youth. He proposed that each Member pay a sum of Rs. 100 per month in order to be able to pay a higher rent to the Archdiocese. It is good to the fair to the Church and the Archdiocese. Under no circumstances can the sum proposed by the Archbishop be paid. The Club can't afford it. He said that the House should decide on a sum per month to be paid by each Member (maybe Rs.50) and give that amount as an additional payment.

Fr Jayanathan – said that he liked the sentence Ian had used about the Members being part of the Church. He said that the Bangalore Diocese had 6 sections. 4 have been badly affected by the pandemic. The Church is in a very tight situation. The hike in rent was proposed by the Estate Committee. He urged the House to think global and act locally. He suggested that a few Members be nominated to work with the Estate Committee to resolve this issue. This matter needs to be sorted out amicably and generously. The money is being used for charitable acts only.

lan Faria (Membership #357) – Suggested that a decision be taken as to what each Member can pay every month and close it as there is pressure from the Bishop's house.

Charles Rogers (Membership #1601) – asked the House to wait for 6 months. Don't fix an amount just yet.

Ian Faria (Membership #357) - suggested an upper limit is fixed and only then discussions should be held with the Estate Committee. It is fair to both the Club and the Church.

Reena Fernandes (Membership #2312) - suggested a Committee be set up and they be given the mandate to take a decision. A time limit must be put in place for this decision to be made.

Sunita D'Souza (Membership #1887) – asked if a sum of 2 lakhs is being proposed as an upper limit per month.

Fr. Jayanathan – said the amount being proposed was very low. He suggested the nominated members sit with the Estate Committee and discuss this in a cordial fashion.

President - the Rental Agreement is long term This is not a revision of rent - it is an additional amount to be paid.

Marion D'Silva (Membership #100151) – Will this amount be added to the current rental agreement? If so, then a sum of Rs. 100 per month per member, should be considered if it helps the Diocese.

Brian D'Lima (Membership #204) – said that an unnecessary burden was being put on Members. No notice has been given for this proposal. An EGM should be called for and a decision made.

Greg D'Sa (Membership #234) - agreed with what Brian said.

Ian Faria (Membership #357) – said that the Committee should be formed quickly so that a decision on amount to be paid could be made. An EGM could be called for final approval. A final decision cannot be taken today. Those interested can attend the AGM and put forth their points, if any.

Brian D'Lima (Membership #204) – said that this should be done before 31st March 2022.

Fr Jayanathan – said that this matter has already been long delayed. This needs to be expedited as the Diocese needs the money.

Brian D'Lima (Membership #204) – enquired if the rent of Rs.204000 for St Thomas building continues? The building next door is slotted for Youth Welfare activities.

Fr Jayanathan - said that this could be included as a proposal in a letter to the Bishop.

The House decided that the Committee should comprise of the following: Ian Faria
Brian D'Lima
KT Sebastian

The matter would also be routed through the PFC.

Greg D'Sa (Membership #234) – suggested that Aloysious Fernandes should also be included. The President said it would be done if necessary.

It has been a year for the record books! There are phrases used throughout the year that feel overused but are also accurate in their description of our experience.

Words such as pandemic, resilience, social distancing, pivoting, and more. Here is a quote that sums it up from Brian Tracy:

"Flexibility in a time of great change is a vital quality of leadership."

It has been a pleasure serving as the President of Catholic Club for the last three years. I would like to thank all of you dear members for restoring your faith in me and re-electing me as your President for another term. It is indeed an honor and privilege to serve the club. It was heartening to see a large turnout during those difficult times at the 69thAnnual General Body Meeting which was held on the 28th of November 2021. Thankfully we have members who are very much interested in the Club's affairs that attended the meeting and participated constructively.

As President since November 2021, I've been very lucky to meet with many members and future members. From these meetings, formal and informal, I've witnessed first-hand how so many of our members have stood strong in the face of the Covid-19 storm. 

I am grateful and thank all the Members of the Permanent Committees of the club for their advice and guidance and to the dedicated hardworking Staff of the Club for their support through the year.


Thank you to my most supportive Managing Committee who stood by me to make the best decisions for the benefit of the club.


Last but not least a big shout out to all you Members for having participated in all the programmes and making them a great success. God Bless all of You and Your Families.



The Investment for Club this year has grown by 8.32%, (Rs.1.31 Cr) from Rs.1,575.93 Lakhs (Rs.15.75 Crores) to Rs.1,707.14 Lakhs (Rs.17.07 Crores). The Gross Bottom line of the Club this year has a Deficit of Rs.8.81 Lakhs, without taking Depreciation into account, compared to the previous Year's deficit of Rs.41.64 Lakhs. This year, Depreciation amount has decreased by 5%, from Rs.132.92 Lakhs to Rs.126.20 Lakhs of last year. After taking Depreciation into account, the Nett Bottom-Line Deficit is Rs.30.81 Lakhs, with previous year's Deficit being Rs.136.32 Lakhs. The Building Fund now stands at Rs.515.94 Lakhs (Rs.5.15 Crores). The Reserves & Surplus Fund roughly represents the Net Value of Fixed Assets of the Club, while the Capital fund represents the Membership Fees, received from Life & Donor Members. An amount of Rs.628.77 Lakhs from the Investment Account is allocated towards the Capital Fund and the interest earned from this Corpus, supports the annual subscription revenue of Life and Donor Members who do not pay the regular Membership Subscription.

The Pie Charts below give an indication of where the Income came from and where it was spent.





The Departmental Analysis of our Club is as below. Let us all give it a keen reading. It is our Club and I am sure many of us will be concerned with the figures as much as I am. The figures mentioned here are rounded for quick understanding. The growth vis-à-vis last fiscal must not be considered as a high improvement since majority of the revenue generating departments were not operational for close to close to 4 months.

BAR

The Turnover of our Bar has increased this year to Rs.558.25 Lakhs from Rs.301.55 Lakhs. The surplus has increased by Rs.47.59 Lakhs as Net Surplus increased this year to Rs.72.08 Lakhs from Rs.24.50 Lakhs of last year.

BILLIARDS

We the Members have always supported the Deficit in this department to foster the talent within the Club and many of our members have brought us accolades at the City, State and National levels. The Deficit has increased by Rs.2.10 Lakhs due to increased expenses in Tournament and Salary. It should still be a matter of concern for us that this Dept. continues to bleed. The Net Deficit this year is Rs.6.68 Lakhs as against Rs.4.57 Lakhs of last year. This Dept. has is the third highest Deficit contributor to the Club.

CAFETERIA

This Dept. has increased income this year of Rs.343.80 Lakhs as against Rs.157.12 of last year. The Net Surplus increased this year to Rs.17.01 Lakhs as against the last year deficit of Rs.14.38 Lakhs. There is an urgent need to redeploy the Staff in this Dept. in a more efficient manner as the employee cost has gone up this year to Rs.38.32 Lakhs from Rs.34.16 Lakhs of last year.

CARDS

This Dept. which is mainly sponsored by the elderly and senior citizens has a Net Deficit this year of Rs.1.97 Lakhs as against a Net Deficit of Rs.1.81 Lakhs in the last year. The stand taken by the Managing Committee to permit Guests in this Dept. to the extent allowed has increased the Income this year to Rs.4.83 Lakhs from Rs.2.49 Lakhs of last year.

CHAMBERS

The Cash Cow of the Club had a increase in Income from Rs.17.82 Lakhs in the last year to Rs.47.30 Lakhs in this year, mainly because this department was shut down for most of last year (2020-2021) Costs in this Dept. this year went up to Rs.33.40 Lakhs from Rs.26.99 Lakhs of last year resulting in a Net Surplus of Rs.13.90 Lakhs as against deficit of Rs.9.17 Lakhs in the last year.

HEALTH CLUB

Our Health Club is equipped with the state-of-the-art equipment. Although we had an increased income of Rs.10.80 Lakhs this year from Rs.7.49 Lakhs of last year, the expenses also increased to Rs.24.23 Lakhs from Rs.16.57 Lakhs resulting in an increased deficit of Rs.14.43 Lakhs from Rs.g.07 of last year. This Dept. has is the second highest Deficit contributor to the Club.

HOUSIE

The Income had increased to Rs.15.76 Lakhs from Rs.5.57 Lakhs in the last year. Again here too, the Housie activity could not be conducted for most of last year (2020-2021) Net surplus this year is Rs.2.0 Lakhs from last year's deficit of Rs.14,00.00 of last year.

SPORTICO

This is the High Activity area of our Club consisting of Badminton, Squash, Outdoor & Indoor Sporting activities and so on. We also hire out our Sporting Infrastructure for similar sporting activities to foster fellowship among the sporting fraternity. The total Income in this Dept. this year of Rs.7.59 Lakh against last year's Rs.3.21 Lakhs. The Net Deficit this year was Rs.14.93 Lakhs vs last year of Rs.3.63 Lakhs. This Dept. has bled the Club highest this year in terms of value.

LIBRARY

Our library is responsible for some of our members improving their Knowledge and Oratory skills, thanks to the books available here on a plethora of subjects. Others too must follow suit and utilise this resource available to them. This Dept. had an Income drop from Rs.232,000 in the last year to Rs. 64,000 this year. The Net Deficit has increased his year to Rs.468,000 from Rs.310,000 of last year.

SWIMMING POOL

Due to the continued Pandemic influence, our Pool could have an Income only from Oct 2021. Hence income could increase from Rs.4.02 Lakhs to Rs.25.49 Lakhs this year. In 2019-2020 this Dept. recorded an Income of Rs.42.87 Lakhs and the Net Surplus improved to Rs.7.59 Lakhs against a Net Deficit of Rs.9.50 Lakhs of last year.

SOCIALS & GET-TOGETHERS

The total Income in this Dept. this year increased to Rs.123.26 Lakhs from Rs.39.55 Lakhs of last year. In addition, the expenses too spiralled by to Rs.78.75 Lakhs as against Rs.28.42 Lakhs in the last year. This Dept. ended the year with a Surplus of Rs.44.50 Lakhs as against a Surplus of Rs.11.12 Lakhs in the previous year.

GENERAL ACTIVITIES & ADMINISTRATION

The Income of this year at Rs.238.66 Lakhs as against Rs.243.27 Lakhs which comes from Subscription, Occasional Members, Banquet Hall charges & Interest on FD's. The Total Employee Cost went up this year to Rs.152.01 Lakhs as against Rs.107.85 Lakhs in the last year. House Keeping which was sub-contracted earlier is now handled by us. I be accrued in the next year. The Dept. ended this year with a Net Deficit of Rs.106.58 Lakhs as against a Deficit of Rs.21.85 Lakhs in the last year, the main contributors being Rent, Staff Salary, Insourced Housekeeping and General Upkeep & Maintenance of Infrastructure.

My thanks go out to all the Club Staff in general and to Team Accounts in particular who have been co-operative in implementing some changed protocols in the way the departments functioned. We are continuously working on new ways of managing the various departments to be more effective and efficient.

A Big Thanks to all my colleagues in the Managing Committee who put up with my shortcomings and my protocols towards Purchases and Payments.



We opened up the Catholic Club to Live Bridge Tournaments, the first in Bangalore after Covid times and is very popular.


We also had the Catholic Club Annual open tournament run very smoothly by Mr. Satyan which was well attended much appreciated by all.

The new year started with a bang, **Ladies in Wonderland** - florally themed, saw all the girls come out in their flowery best. Fun, food and festivity was the need of the hour.



Election Process

- Proceed to the Polling Booth and
- Mark your chosen candidate with the rubber stamp provided.
- Choose one candidate for President, Vice President, Treasurer Lady Member, Youth Member
- Choose two candidates for Advisory Member
- Choose ten candidates for Managing Committee Members.
- Choose One Member each for Permanent Finance Committee, Permanent Project Committee and Permanent Information **Technology Committee**
- Do not cross out any names.
- Marking less or more candidates than the required number will render the vote invalid.
- Fold the ballot paper and drop it in one of the boxes provided.
- Leave the polling booth.

Kindly Note:

- 1. Only Permanent Members who
 - Have been on the rolls for at least 6 months prior to 31st March 2022.
 - are in possession of valid Smart Card and
 - Have cleared subscription and other dues upto June 2022 are eligible to attend the AGM and to vote.
- 2. Non-voting Members, their families and families of voting Members shall not enter the Hall.
- 3. Consultation/discussion will not be permitted in the Polling Booth / Hall during balloting.
- 4. Candidates will refrain from canvassing 24 hours before the polling commences.
- 5. Registration for balloting to the elections for the Managing Committee shall be open until thirty minutes prior to closure of balloting.
- 6. The register for balloting shall be separate from that of the general body meeting.
- 7. Any complaint regarding the election process should be addressed only to the Election Officer and his decision shall be final and binding.
